April 28, 2024 FIFTH SUNDAY OF EASTER Today's Focus: Getting Pruned

Pruning plants is a drastic process. Old growth is snipped away to what may seem like a dangerous level, yet its severity is a way in which new fruit can be produced in abundance.

FIRST READING: Acts 9.26-31

Acts of the Apostles contains numerous transitions. It begins in Jerusalem and ends in Rome. Its initial focus is on Jews and expands to include Gentiles. Its initial protagonist is Peter, but it devotes more space to Paul (Called Saul in Hebrew), who appears first in Acts as Stephen's executioner. Soon afterward he encounters Jesus on the road to Damascus, converts and is baptized. The church has always experienced conflict, and our first reading reflects this both internally and externally. Yet as if inevitably, the church throughout the region continues to experience the encouragement "of the Holy Spirit" and to grow in faith and numbers. Increasingly, it is Paul, the former persecutor, who is the cause of this.

SECOND READING: 1 John 3.18-24

The verses preceding our reading introduce the love that we are to express not just in word but in action. It is God's love and so not something we can take credit for. Our second reading identifies two aspects of what it means "to keep his commandments." "Name" can stand for the very essence of a person, and so when First John states "we should believe in [Jesus'] name," it means for us to commit ourselves fully to who he is and what he does. Second, Jesus supplies a model for how "we should love one another," namely by laying "down our lives for" others (verse 16). In the face of such a challenging model our reading seeks to "reassure our hearts." God, who is love, loves us, and we can "have confidence in God."

GOSPEL: John 15.1-8

Our Gospel readings for the last three Sundays of the Easter season are drawn from the farewell discourse in John that precedes Jesus' arrest. Twice in our reading, Jesus associates himself with the God revealed so majestically on Mt. Horeb by stating "I am" and so seems to distance himself from us. Yet the image of the vine he uses to describe himself connects each of us, a branch, directly to him, and through him not only in community to other branches (or people) but also to the God of all creation. Seven times he speaks of abiding. We are to "remain" intimately connected to Jesus. Six times he mentions "fruit." Our remaining with him is productive; it bears fruit but not without the pruning or challenges that faith always entails.
