

### PENTECOST SUNDAY

## Today's Focus: A Journey of Prayer

We do not pray as we ought, and so we remain on a spiritual journey, striving to pray ever more as we ought. The Spirit guides us on that journey, in which we pray as we can.

#### FIRST READING: Acts 2.1-11

Scholars propose that in Luke-Acts the Holy Spirit is actually a character, actively engaged in forwarding the narrative. Today's first reading celebrates the significant moment in the work of the Holy Spirit. In Acts, the coming of the Holy Spirit signals that the mission of Jesus begun in the Gospel will now continue in the words and deeds of the apostles, deacons, and disciples. The Holy Spirit will embolden Peter (Acts 4:8), select deacons (Acts 6:3), strengthen Stephen (Acts7:55), fill Saul who will become Paul (Acts 9:17), inspire the growth of the churches (Acts 9:31), and inaugurate and confirm the Gentile mission (Acts 10:44). In the concluding scene, Paul is preaching to the Jews in Rome and invokes the Holy Spirit, who spoke through the prophet Isaiah (Acts28:25). In Luke's understanding of salvation history, the Holy Spirit represents Jesus' presence in the church until he comes in glory.

## SECOND READING: Galatians5:16-25

In Paul's Letter to the Galatians, he has systematically attempted to convince the Galatians of their wrong-headed misunderstanding of the gospel (3:1-3). Today's reading is part of an exhortation, designed to redirect them towards the appropriate way of life. They are to live in the Spirit, which serves as a down payment for their future life (2 Corinthians 1:22) and strengthens the believers who await the hope of righteousness (Galatians 5:5). The Spirit stands against the flesh, which symbolizes the desire to follow earthly passions. Paul presents a list of virtues and vices, a common place in ethical exhortations. When one lives by the Spirit, virtues like love, joy, and peace abound. But the works of the flesh lead to acts immorality. Paul places directive before the Galatians: "If we live in the Spirit, let us also follow the Spirit" (Galatians 5:25).

# GOSPEL: John 15:26-27; 16:12-15

The Gospel reading is part of a larger section of John's Gospel that scholars refer to as Jesus' farewell speech. Typically, within this literal genre, the speaker would announce his departure (John 13:33;14:2-3;16:16), evoking a response in the listeners (John 14:1;27;16:6-7,22). In other Old Testament farewells the speaker would recount the deeds of God, but here Jesus recalls what he has previously told the disciples. But Jesus does not leave the disciples orphaned. Where the Synoptics prefer the term "Holy Spirit," John uses "Advocate," which in the Greek also means "helper". This "helper" is the Spirit of Truth, who proceeds from the Father and will guide the disciples in Jesus' absence. The disciples are, in essence, to partner with this Advocate, since both the Spirit of truth and the disciples testify to Jesus (15:26-27).
