THE MOST HOLY TRINITY

Today's Focus: Children of God

The deepest of bonds between parents and children, among siblings and other family members, don't exist on the surface, but deep within—where the Spirit dwells.

FIRST READING: Deuteronomy 4:32-34,39-40

The author/editor of Deuteronomy collected the narratives and laws of Moses and fashioned them in such a way as to highlight both the saving action of God and the conditional nature of the covenant. Israel must “keep his statutes and commandments” so as to prosper in the land God had given. In other texts edited by the hand of the Deuteronomistic historian, particularly Judges, we learn how often Israel failed to keep the commandments and the suffering and chaos that resulted.

SECOND READING: Romans 8:14-17

Paul's Letter to the Romans echoes a similar sentiment. The Spirit of God has made believers into children of God, whom they may call by the similar term *Abba*. As heirs of God and joint heirs with Christ, believers are to share in the sufferings of Christ, but also to share in his glory. In Deuteronomy, the Israelites were to obey the commandments in response to God's saving action. In Romans, the believers are to hold fast the example of Christ.

GOSPEL: Matthew 28:16-20

The Gospel reading presents the resurrected Jesus commissioning the disciples on a mountain in Galilee. The image is purposely meant to evoke the scene of Moses on Mount Sinai. Throughout his Gospel, Matthew has carefully shown how Jesus is not only the new Moses, but the one who fulfills every righteousness (Matthew 5:17-20). The disciples are to teach not the laws of Moses but the moral principles of Jesus, as expressed chiefly in the Sermon on the Mount. The commission is broad (all nations) and the baptism formula Trinitarian (“in the name of the father, and of the Son, and the Holy Spirit” [Matthew 28:19]). Jesus' closing words, “I am with you always,” harken back to the Infancy Narrative, in which Jesus is said to be fulfillment of Isaiah's prophecy, “they shall name him ‘Emmanuel’ which means ‘God is with us’” (Matthew 1:23).

- ❖ How do you experience the Holy Spirit connecting you to the Father, Jesus, and other people?
