

THIRTY -THIRD SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

Today's Focus: God, Our Inheritance

When it comes to our lives of faith and belief, we can understand that what we've inherited; and that inheritance is also ours to hand on to the future.

FIRST READING: Daniel 12.1-3

Daniel's apocalyptic vision reflects a time in early Judaism when beliefs in resurrection began to take shape. An angel begins to tell Daniel of the final deliverance of Israel under the archangel Michael, whose military success in God's apocalyptic battle with evil facilitates the escape of the righteous elect. The final deliverance of the righteous comes in the form of resurrection in the afterlife. The nature of their resurrection varies according to their level of righteousness. For starters, not all rise. Of the "many" who do, some are rewarded with "everlasting life" and others consigned to "everlasting disgrace." Within the former group, some join the angels, which is what becoming like stars means. This reward comes to those who are especially wise and to those who lead many others to righteousness.

SECOND READING: Hebrews 10.11-14,18

The author of Hebrews has alternated between explanation and exhortation in an attempt to shore up the faith of believers, who are experiencing rejection by their neighbors and risk abandoning their faith (Hebrews 10:32-34). Today's reading returns to the image of Christ as the true high priest. The temple priests made daily sacrifices to atone for sins (Hebrews 10:11), but Christ need make only one. The sacrifices of the temple priests were not effective in remitting sin. Christ's sacrifice not only granted him a seat at the right hand of God (Hebrews 10:12), but perfected those who are being consecrated to God. But if the believers' sin after having received the truth, sacrifices will no longer be enough. Rather, they will face a "fearful prospect of judgment" (Hebrews 10:26-27).

GOSPEL: Mark 13.24-32

Jesus's speech in Mark 13 draws on apocalyptic themes, language and literature. His description of celestial events here matches how Israel's prophets spoke of the coming "day of the Lord," their expression for judgment day. Earlier, Jesus used "Son of Man" to refer to himself, notably in his Passion predictions (8:31; 9:31; 10:33-34). Here, Jesus' description of "Son of Man" connects him with that glorious figure of Daniel 7:13-14, to whom God gives everlasting dominion. The fig tree parable reinforces the point that certain events portend the arrival of a new age. Writing at a time when Christians began to grapple with the delay of Jesus' second coming, which the first generation believed would take place in their lifetime, Mark emphasizes Jesus' words as trustworthy. His readers must not get stuck down in end-times speculation since ultimately only God knows "of that day or hour."

REFLECTIONS:

- What events have made you feel as though the end is near?
- Where has an awareness of God's presence helped life go on for you?
