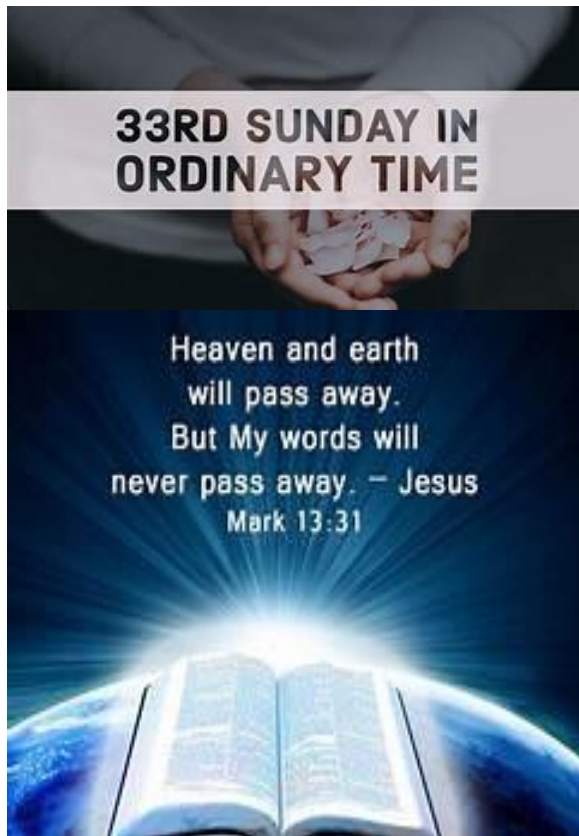

OUR LORD JESUS CHRIST, KING OF THE UNIVERSE

Today's Focus: Recognizing Your King

When Jesus was standing next to Pilate, few would have thought him to be the royal figure in the scene. Today, we are called on to see our king where others don't (or can't) find or acknowledge him.

FIRST READING: Daniel 7:13-14

The visions of Daniel depict the sufferings of the Jews under the persecution of Antiochus IV Epiphanes (167-164 B.C.), but the real culprits are disguised as Israel's historic enemies. Prior to the passage that we read today; Daniel had seen four different beasts emerge from the sea (Daniel 7:3). Representing the Babylonian, Median, Persian, and Greek kingdoms, these beasts hold sway until the heavenly court intervenes (Daniel 7:10-11, 26). Then "one like a Son of man," who symbolizes "the holy ones of the Most High" (Daniel 7:18), descends from heaven. This one receives dominion, glory, and kingship by the Ancient of Days (Daniel 7:14). Scholars disagree as to whether this Son of man is meant as a symbol for the divine kingdom or for a messianic king himself. Ezekiel uses the term, but he seems to refer simply to a human being (Ezekiel 2:1). The evangelists and other early Christians understood Jesus as the embodiment of the apocalyptic "Son of man" of Daniel.

SECOND READING: Revelation 1.5-8

The reading from Revelation describes Jesus as "faithful witness," "firstborn of the dead," and "ruler of the kings of the earth." This passage's relevance for the Solemnity of Christ the King comes especially from the third descriptor, a statement that looks forward to the full realization of God's kingdom on earth, when Jesus' heavenly reign will break into the earthly realm. That Jesus has gathered believers into a kingdom made of "priests" for God signals that he has achieved God's intentions for the people of Israel, revealed to them at Mount Sinai, to "be to me a kingdom of priests, a holy nation" (Exodus 19:6). The allusions in verse 7 to Daniel 7:13 (the Son of man sequence) and Zechariah 12:10 anticipate this new age under Jesus' rule. The subject of verse 8 shifts from Jesus to God, who speaks the announcement proclaimed there.

GOSPEL: John 18.33b-37

Jesus' trials before Pilate in John's Gospel revolves around the theme of Jesus' kingship. Rather than answer Pilate's question directly and speak of himself as "King of the Jews," Jesus speaks of his kingdom that "does not belong to this world," namely the heavenly realm from which he came (1:1-18). By coming into this world, Jesus seeks not to rule or dominate but "to testify to the truth." In the course of this trial, Jesus offers his voice to Pilate. Pilate will recognize Jesus' revelation (18:38) and thus expose himself as not belonging to the truth.

REFLECTIONS:

- How do you describe the truth that Jesus came to share with us?
- How does your life make it known that you serve Christ, the King of the Universe?
