FEBRUARY 2, 2025 THE PRESENTATION OF THE LORD

Today's Focus: Jesus Christ, Light from Light

This feast of light beckons us to see the glory of God's saving power revealed in Jesus. Like Simeon, we have seen salvation in Christ.

FIRST READING: Malachi 3.1-4 The Lord whom you seek will suddenly come to his temple.

The reading from the prophet Malachi promises the coming of the messenger who will prepare the way for God. The Lord, the messenger of the covenant, will appear suddenly in the temple. Whether the prophet envisioned two beings—a messenger preparing the way of the Lord, the messenger of the covenant—is uncertain. In the Gospel of Matthew, Jesus quotes this verse from Malachi in reference to John the Baptist (Matthew 11:10), whom he sees as the messenger who has prepared the way. In light of today's Gospel, Malachi's prophecy of the sudden appearance of the Lord in the temple is fulfilled by the presentation of the infant Jesus in the temple.

SECOND READING: Hebrews 2.10-11,13b-18 ++ Jesus had to become like his brothers and sisters in every respect.

The reading from Hebrews picks up the temple imagery. Jesus is the high priest who expiates the sins of his people, not because he was divine but because he was human, sharing "in blood and flesh." How to understand Jesus' nature and his saving act became an important theological concern among the early Christians. Jesus was truly human as evidenced by his suffering and death, living in a state lower than the angels. Yet now he is raised above all creation and crowned with glory and honor. The Letter to the Hebrews (most likely a sermon written down later in letter form) attempts to encourage believers whom the author fears are in danger of apostasy—renouncing their faith.

GOSPEL: Luke 2.22-40 *My eyes have seen your salvation.*

According to the laws of Leviticus (12:2-8), a woman who bears a son is considered impure for forty days during which time she cannot touch anything sacred or enter the sanctuary. At the end of the period, a lamb is presented to the temple as burnt offering and a pigeon or turtledove for a purification offering. If one could not afford a lamb, then two turtledoves could serve as a substitute. The Gospel reading conflates Mary's purification and Jesus' consecration to the Lord as the firstborn son (Exodus 13:2,12). While fulfilling their religious responsibilities, the family encounters Simeon and Anna, two exemplars of righteousness. Both recognize the extraordinary child. Simeon calls him "a light of revelation to the Gentiles" and Anna speaks about the child to all who are awaiting the redemption of Israel.

REFLECTIONS:

- Do I live my life, like Simeon, in active anticipation of the revelation of God's glory?
- What hinders me from worshiping God worthily? What worries and anxieties hold me back from giving myself over to God?
