Luke 9:28b-36

Peter said to Jesus, "Master, it is good for us to be here; let us make three dwellings, one for you, one for Moses, and one for Elijah," but Peter did not know what he said. While he was saying this, a cloud came and overshadowed them; and they were terrified as they entered the cloud. Then from the cloud came a voice that said, "This is my Son, my Chosen; Listen to him!"

#### MARCH 23, 2025 THIRD SUNDAY OF LENT Today's Focus: Re-visioning We all operate from a basic view, or vision, of life. The way we view God, others, and life guides most of our actions. Lent calls us back to a vision of justice, peace, mercy, and joy.

#### FIRST READING: Exodus 3.1-8a, 13-15 Moses, you will tell the children of Israel: I AM has sent me to you.

The call of Moses is narrated in today's first reading. Reading the text closely reveals an interesting and often overlooked aspect. God must be introduced to Moses: "I am the God of your fathers... the God od Abraham, the God of Isaac, the God of Jacob" (Exodus 3:6). Since Moses had been raised in Pharaoh's household (2:10), we can imagine that his knowledge of Hebraic religious tradition was likely lacking. In fact, he appears to have failed to circumcise his son (4:24-26). Despite his less than scrupulous religious upbringing and his immoral behaviour (killing an Egyptian, 2:11), God commissions Moses to rescue God's people (3:10). And thus begins the prophetic ministry of Moses who armed with God's promises, will lead the people from slavery into "a land flowing with milk and honey" (Exodus 3:8).

#### SECOND READING: 1 Corinthians 10.1-6, 10-12 *Our ancestor's experience in the desert under Moses is recorded to instruct us.*

In today's second reading we hear, "Our ancestors were all under the cloud and all passed through the sea" (1 Corinthians 10:1). But Paul interprets the event through a Christological lens. "They drank from a spiritual rock that followed them, and the rock was the Christ" (1 Corinthians 10:4). Despite the guidance of Moses and the presence of God, not all the Hebrews survived the desert. The privilege of presence does not guarantee that one pleases God; thus, Paul charges the Corinthians not to grumble (another reference to the wandering Hebrews {(Exodus 16:}).

#### GOSPEL: Luke 13.1-9 Unless you turn back to God, you will perish as they did.

The suffering and illness resulting from sin was a common theological understanding in first-century Judaism (John 9:2). The deaths of the Galileans at the hand of Pilate and the accidental deaths of eighteen at Siloam were thought to have resulted not from malicious rulers of faulty construction but from the behaviour of the victims. In today's reading, Jesus uses these examples to remind his disciples of the need to repent. He argues that death awaits all, regardless of guilt. Since the time is short, their repentance needs to be timely. The parable of the fig tree seems to suggest that repentance is welcomed with compassion. Finding no fruit, the owner intended to cut the tree down. Only at the insistence (and compassion) of the gardener did the owner relent. "I shall cultivate the ground around it and fertilize it; it may bear fruit in the future" (Luke 13:8-9).
