John 10:27-30

My sheep hear my voice. And I know them, and they follow me. I give them eternal life, and they shall never perish; And no one will snatch them out of my hand. What my Father gave to me is greater than all, and no one can snatch them out of my hand Father's hand. I and the Father are one.

May 18, 2025 FIFTH SUNDAYOF EASTER Today's Focus: A Faith in the Flesh Though the Resurrection moved Jesus to a place beyond his mortal body, we still believe that God took on our flesh in him. He continues to be enfleshed through our own lives.

FIRST READING: Acts 14.21b -27 They called the Church together and related all that God had done with them.

The first reading from Acts describes the end of Paul and Barnabas' first missionary journey, when they reverse their travels and revisit those who have come to faith (Acts 14:21). Paul and Barnabas warn these new believers that "hardships" await them, and then set up a "parish council" of sorts: "They appointed elders ... in church" (Acts 14:23). As Acts presents it, elders in local communities appear to be the earliest form of local church organization. Evangelists and apostles like Paul established house churches but left the development of those communities in local hands.

SECOND READING: Revelation 21.1-5a *God will wipe every tear from their eyes.*

The various visions beheld by John on Patmos tell the story of the final days, culminating in the glorious vision of a new creation. Christ's return signals the nearness of the end (Revelation 19:11-18). A final battle (19:19-21) will unseat Satan for all eternity (20:1-3). Following the final (20:11-15), God's reign will be experienced in its fullness (1:1-8). That fullness is described in today's second reading as the creation of a new heaven and a new earth. Drawing on the visions of Ezekiel (37:27), John reports, "God dwelling is with the human race... God himself will always be with them" (Revelation 21:3). The old order of suffering persecution, and death will cease, for God has announced, "Behold, I make all things new" (21:5)

GOSPEL: John 13.1, 31-33a, 34-35++ *I give you a new commandment, that you love one another.*

In the Gospel of John, the actions of Judas are presented as motivated not by his greed but by the desires of the devil (John 13:2). When Judas takes the morsel from Jesus, Satan enters him ((John 13:27). But these evil machinations only serve to further the plan of God. Throughout this Gospel, Jesus has remarked that his hour of glory had not yet come (2:4;7:30; 8:20), but with Judas's action Jesus announces, "Now is the Son of the Man glorified" (13:31). As Jesus prepares for his glorification, he leaves his disciples with a new commandment: "love one another. As I have loved you, so you also should love another" (13:34). Jesus will exemplify what that love looks like – "No one has greater love than this, to lay down one's life for one's friends" (15:13)—and thus his glorification will be complete.

REFLECTIONS:

- Where have you had a taste of the newness God promises?
- Give an example of a sacrificial love that has helped you through life.
