John 13.1,31-33a,34-35

As a new commandment I give to you:

Love one another, as I have loved you, so you must love another.

By this everyone will know that you are my disciples, if you love one another.

May 25, 2025 SIXTH SUNDAYOF EASTER Today's Focus: Living in the Promise As Jesus readied his friends for his departure at the Ascension, he consoled them with the promise of the Holy Spirit, sent as an Advocate, or helper, as they continue his mission.

FIRST READING: Acts 15.1-2, 22-29 It has seemed good to the Holy Spirit and to us to impose on you no further burden than what is essential.

In today's reading, we hear the authoritative letter composed by the Jerusalem church on the question of the admission of the Gentiles. All the laws followed by the Jews were not to be forced upon the Gentile believers. They need only abstain from idol meat, from blood, meat of strangled animals, and unlawful marriage (Acts 15:29). These restrictions are absent from Paul's version of the Jerusalem Council described in Galatians 2:1-10, in which no restrictions were placed on the Gentiles. Luke may have conflated two different events, a council that dealt with questions of circumcision and a decree concentrating dietary laws for Gentiles. Though Gentiles had come to faith during Paul and Barnabas's first missionary journey, the Council of Jerusalem now makes possible a wholesale evangelization of the Gentiles.

SECOND READING: Revelation 21.10-14, 22-23 The Angel showed me the holy city Jerusalem coming down out of heaven from God.

In today's second reading, we hear Ezekiel's vision of the new Jerusalem (Ezekiel 40-48) updated for a later period. Traditionally, the remnant of the faithful would be gathered in Jerusalem to await the messianic age (Micah 4:6-8). In today's reading, that wait is ended, Jerusalem is presented as a bride of the Lamb (Revelation 21:9) and the city symbolizes the church. The wall surrounding the city consists of twelve courses of stones, representing the apostles, the foundation of the church. The seer describes a city shaped like a giant cube (Revelation 21:15-17), a symbol of perfection (1 Kings 6:19-20), which needs neither sun or moon, for the glory of God illuminates it.

GOSPEL: John 14.23-29 The Holy Spirit will teach you everything, and remind you all that I have said to you.

The Gospel reads as a foreshadowing of the gift of the Spirit in John 20:19-23. Today Jesus tells the disciples, "Peace I leave with you; my peace I give you" (John 14:27). He will greet them with peace after the Resurrection: "Jesus came and stood in their midst and said to them, "Peace be with you" (20:21). The Advocate sent by the Father will teach and remind the disciples all that they learned from Jesus (14:26). This advocate is the Holy Spirit (14:26), which Jesus would breathe upon the disciples (20:22). Jesus makes good on his promise to return (14:28) by appearing to the disciples despite the locked doors (20:19)

- Describe how you experience the guidance of the Advocate, the Holy Spirit, in your life.
