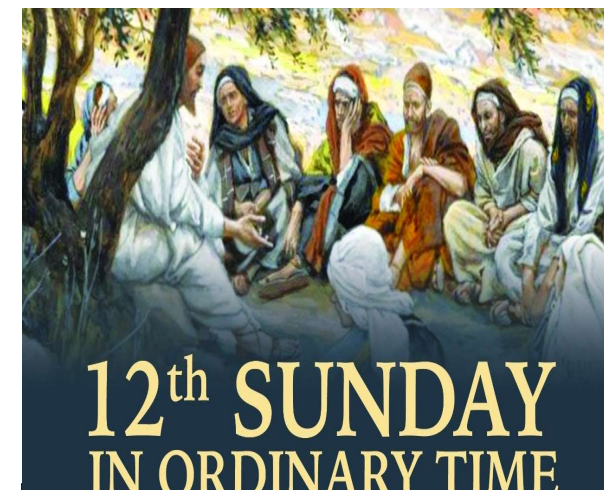

**MATTHEW 10:26-33**

Jesus said to the Twelve: "Fear no one. Nothing is concealed that will not be revealed, nor secret that will not be known. What I say to you in the darkness, speak in the light; What you hear whispered, proclaim on the housetops. And do not be afraid of those who kill the body but cannot kill the soul; rather, be afraid of the one who can destroy both body and soul in Gehenna."

**THIRTEENTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME**

***Today's Focus: The Water's Fine!***

***We often use simple comparison for Baptism, from a bath to ritual cleansing. Like the surface of water itself, these don't truly communicate what lies beneath, or how truly deep it is.***

**FIRST READING: 2 Kings 4.8-12a, 14-16**

*This man is a holy man of God. He can stay here whenever he comes to us.*

The Jewish Bible arranges the books of Joshua through Kings under the heading of the Prophets. More particularly, they are identified as the Former Prophets because they narrate the activities of early Jewish prophets. (The Latter Prophets include Isaiah, Jeremiah, Ezekiel, and the twelve minor prophets.) In Second Kings, Elisha, also called "a holy man of God," interacts with a woman of some means who offers him hospitality and even adds and furnishes a room to accommodate him when he passes through on his travels. In gratitude, Elisha asks what she lacks; nothing, she replies (verse 13). Elisha persists and identifies a need the woman and her husband may have overlooked. Elsewhere Elisha addresses kings and matters of state, but Chapter 4 and our reading reflect a desire to instill hope in life's ordinary circumstances.

**SECOND READING: Romans 6.3-4, 8-11**

*We have been buried with Christ Jesus by baptism into death, so we too might walk in newness of life.*

Our reading responds to what may have been a follow-up question, "Shall we persist in sin that grace may abound?" The short answer is, "Of course not!" (6:1). Our reading, which also appears a crucial point in the Easter Vigil, addresses baptism that has incorporated us into Jesus. "We have grown," like vines intertwining, "into union with him" (6:5). The past event of baptism has implications for the future— "we shall... live with him" (6:8)—and for the present. The intimate relationship with Jesus and his body the Church changes us and enables us (nourished by prayer and sacrament) to "live in newness of life."

**GOSPEL: Matthew 10.37-42**

*Do not fear those who kill the body.*

The life of faith is complex. One would not expect the messenger of mercy and peace to sow conflict, but that is what Jesus claims to do in Matthew 10:34. This reading suggests he was also causing division within families. Similarly, one would expect a divinely sanctioned mission to achieve immediate success. Yet, the first appearance of "cross" in the New Testament refers explicitly not to Jesus's crucifixion but to the cost to his followers of carrying out the mission he has given them. Our mission will ultimately succeed, even if we might not in our lifetime. In the meantime, the Good News is not good

for everyone, and its bearers in every age can represent a threat, especially to established order and relationships.

**REFLECTIONS:**

- One enduring question of faith and salvation is this: If we're set free from sin, why aren't we literally free from sin, living a sinless life? in what ways might Paul's exploration of death to sin and life in Christ help answer this question in our own thoughts and actions?



**ROSARY INTENTIONS FOR JUNE:** Let us ask the Sacred Heart of Jesus to seek forgiveness and ask for specific intentions and pray the Litany to the Sacred Heart.
