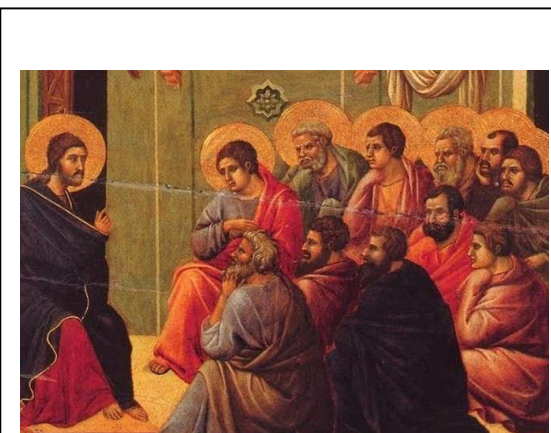

FOURTEENTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

Today's Focus: SEE--ERS

Our faith has relied on prophets—people who see truly and see deeply—since its beginnings. We need them in order for God to be revealed, for it is their sight that helps us see beyond the veil as well.

FIRST READING: Zechariah 9.9-10

Lo, your king comes to you, humble and riding on a

donkey.

Zechariah was likely written to an Israel with reduced dimensions and reduced horizons. The beginning of Chapter 9 envisions God clearing out foreign occupiers and clearing the way for new possibilities. Our reading is informed by memories of better times and anticipates the restoration of national leadership marked by humility and justice. But it hopes for more than just a return to the past. It also imagines something new, namely, leadership propped up not by military might but by a commitment to peace that has global ramifications.

SECOND READING: Romans 8.9, 11-13

If by the Spirit you put to death the deeds of the body you will live.

This week, Lectionary's reading aligns Spirit/live/life against flesh/die/death. Paul's hopelessness is reflected in the frequency with which he mentions the words from each set, ten versus seven times. In addition, three instances of die/death reflect death's defeat by God and (by the power of the Spirit). Paul insists from the start that we are in the spirit. **Dwell** derives from the Greek for house, and so Paul asserts that the Spirit has taken up residence or made its dwelling in the baptized. We are temples, as it were, of the Holy Spirit (see 1 Corinthians 6:19), no longer mortgaged to flesh/die/death.

GOSPEL: Matthew 11.25-30

I am gentle and humble in heart.

Our Gospel passage reverses expectations. It and its surrounding verses reflect misunderstanding among those who should know better—John the Baptist, for example. They also record resistance from religious leaders that reflects the experience of Matthew's own audience. Sodom will fare better than they "on the day of judgment" (11:24). Jesus privileges the "childlike" over "the wise and the learned" in part because the former seem willing to learn (see verse 29) while the latter apparently are not. We close with Jesus urging his audience to remove the burdensome yoke that the religious leaders of his day placed on others and to replace it with his own because his "yoke is easy, and [his] burden light."

REFLECTIONS:

- How do I imagine the world being transfigured by the coming of God's kingdom?
- How can I listen more attentively to Jesus? Where do I go to hear his voice?

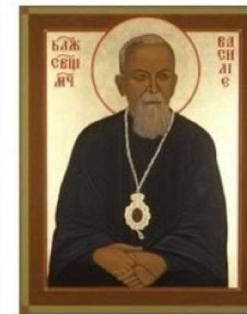
